HIDING IN PLAIN SIGHT

Women represent a lifeline in the 23 million Americans engaged in a recovery lifestyle.





LIVING IN TRUTH

Socialization pathways for women seeking treatment and maintaining recovery are disproportionately rife with demoralizing stigma and shame.

Super imposed societal ideals block greater visibility as leaders and symbols of long-term sustainable recovery in the public forum.

Men- pull themselves out of the muck while women wear the in/visible scarlet letter

Addressing stigmitization of women in SUD/AOD/MH can open doors for more pathways to leadership
